

NCMC and DCAF formalize cooperation to strengthen crisis response capacities in Moldova



The National Crisis Management Center (NCMC) and the Geneva Center for Security Sector Governance (DCAF) signed a Cooperation Agreement within the project "Strengthening Security Sector Governance in Moldova" (2023–2029), financed by the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida).

This agreement strengthens an already functional partnership between NCMC and DCAF, developed through a series of workshops structured on several levels of the national crisis management system:

- operational level - intelligence consolidation and response coordination (February 2026);
- strategic level - risk assessment, inter-institutional planning and decision orientation at national level (April 2026);
- tactical level - field data collection and direct intervention (July 2026).

These workshops contribute to the consolidation of the new crisis management mechanism through which the institutions not only react to crises, but also continuously monitor risk developments, report in a structured way and support the development of unified anticipation and response capacity of the state.

Based on the results already obtained, NCMC and DCAF decided to formalize and expand their efforts, focusing on:

- strengthening the institutional and operational capacities of the NCMC;
- improving government-wide coordination in crisis situations;
- development of institutional learning processes and systems;
- increasing the level of preparedness and resilience at national level, in accordance with European standards and best practices.
